Health and Safety Statement and Policy

West End Bowls Club has a duty of care to safeguard its members, guests, visitors and contractors entering and using the Club and this Policy, as advised by Bowls England, is vital to that purpose.

Our Policy

To create and maintain a safe environment by controlling risks and hazards from bowling activities.

To consult with all who are working on behalf of the Club on matters affecting H & S

To provide information, instructions and supervision of all personnel and volunteers.

To ensure that all personnel and volunteers are competent to play, carry out tasks and given adequate training.

To renew and revise this policy as necessary by carrying out risk assessments, recording and evaluating steps necessary to control hazards found.

Good Practice for Club Members

Know the location of the First Aid Box, the list of current first aiders and those on duty.

Know the Club Emergency Procedures where displayed around the premises.

Check the green and surrounds for safety and raise any concerns.

Ensure that all Club and personal equipment is in a good state of repair.

Ensure that any equipment you are asked to use is in good repair and that you have had adequate training in its use.

Follow Fire safety, Kitchen and Hygiene procedures.

Take reasonable care for your own H & S and that of others.

Co-operate with the Club on H & S issues, correctly use all equipment and do not misuse anything provided for H & S or welfare.
